

# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Language Arts


- Focus on finding key facts and details from information sources then learning how to use these in analysis.
- The three main writing areas are informative, persuasive, and narrative.
- Assignments can include essays, short answer responses, artistic (infographics), and oral presentations.
- Reading assignments include short stories, news articles, poetry, as well as longer books (Maroo, The Cay, Bridge to Terabithia, as well as small group and personal choice books).
- There is also emphasis on grammar, particularly pronouns and prepositions, as well as vocabulary, especially roots.







# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Social Studies





- Focus is on exposing students to ancient civilizations and how to make inferences based on primary and secondary sources.
- Civilizations studied include: Early Humans, Mesopotamia, Egypt, Kush, India, China, Ancient Hebrews, Persia, and Greece.
- Students get to explore these civilizations through a mixture of readings, hands on projects, investigations, and simulation activities.
- The curriculum is supplemented by the social studies-centered art corps lessons and the ancient history museum project in May.




# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Science

- Earth-Earth's processes, human impact on the environment
- Life- Body Systems with Frog Dissections, Inheritance & Heredity, Cell parts and Functions
- Physical Science-Heat transfer: Conduction, Convection, Radiation
- Engineering--(Some examples of what we do in class) designing a prosthetic hand, creating earthquake resistant structures, chocolate chip mining












# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Math



By the end of 5<sup>th</sup> grade, students be fluent in:

- The four basic operations of whole numbers
- Add, subtract, multiply, and divide whole number, decimals, and fractions.


These skills are critical to their success in 6<sup>th</sup> grade.


In 6<sup>th</sup> grade, students learn about:

- Algebraic thinking

# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Math





#### **Compacted Math**

- Two math tracks in PUSD middle schools that are determined before entering Oak Valley
  - Traditional Math: 6,7,8
  - Compacted Math
    - × 6/7 − All of 6<sup>th</sup> grade and half of 7<sup>th</sup> grade
    - × 7/8 − Half of 7<sup>th</sup> grade and all of 8<sup>th</sup> grade
- All students will participate in the same math curriculum with the same textbook; math 6/7 class just moves at a much faster pace.
- There is no movement between tracks during middle school and we do not allow outside courses to count for skipping PUSD math classes.
- Students will be able to accelerate again in high school.
- Both middle school tracks allow for students to take AP math classes in high school.
- Detailed information was sent by the district office to all 5<sup>th</sup> grade families on March 10<sup>th</sup>. If you have questions, please contact your elementary school.



# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: Physical Education

- All students at Oak Valley will be enrolled in one period of PE
- We focus on skill development, goal setting, and sportsmanship.








# Drop off and Pick up

# 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Curriculum: 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Camp

- All 6<sup>th</sup> grade students at Oak Valley have the opportunity to attend Cuyamaca Outdoor School.
- Fully functioning school run by SD County Office of Education, not a tent camp in the wilderness.
- Tentatively scheduled for March.
- Camp is chaperoned by our 6<sup>th</sup> grade faculty.
- This is an amazing opportunity for our new Falcons to get to know their teachers and peers outside of the regular school setting.
- While at camp students participate in a variety of educational and team building activities.

- Social Emotional peer concerns, life situations, grief, parent divorce, anxiety/depression, self esteem, one-on-one/small group counseling, restorative practice/circles





#### **Tips for Success**

- Encourage daily attendance. It makes a big different in your student's learning.
- Encourage your student to do any homework the day it is assigned and assist them with time management.
- Check their planner and help monitor assignments.
- Check Canvas/Synergy Gradebook weekly for assignments and updated grades.
- Communicate with your student's teacher.
- Set goals with your child and celebrate their growth!







#### **Cell Phones/Electronics**

- Students are permitted to carry their cell phone on campus; however, phones must remain OFF (not on SILENT) and out of sight during the ENTIRE school day, 8:00-2:30.
- Students are not permitted to use their phones during the school day unless a teacher asks them to engage with it during a learning activity.

#### **Bullying/Harassment**


- This is a wonderful and kind school!
- Sometimes student do make poor choices.
- We have lots of staff out monitoring students:
  - Teachers have daily supervision responsibilities.
  - Our counselors and administrators are also present before school, during breaks/lunch, and after school.
  - We have two full time campus security guards that work each day as well as 4 dedicated lunch supervisors we call Falcon Guides.
- Our assistant principals push into all classrooms the first two weeks of school to set some behavior expectations for students in a very positive way which really helps set the tone for the year.
- Most importantly of all though, we have really great students and in many ways they police themselves. Our students do not tolerate inappropriate behavior, this is a really kind and safe place to be.
